RESOLUTION NO. 62-2017

RECOMMENDING THE AWARD OF CONTRACTS TO P.I. FARM PRODUCTS, INCORPORATED, HYTEC POWER INC., GAYLAN TECHNOLOGIES, EQUIPMENTS, MACHINERIES & SUPPLIES, ACMI OFFICE SYSTEMS PHILIPPINES, INC., HUMIL INTERNATIONAL CORPORATION AND GOLDTECH INTL. DISTRIBUTORS, INC. FOR THE PROCUREMENT OF TRAINING TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT FOR THE HIGHER LEVEL DAC QUALIFICATION OF THE 23 CENTEXS ON A PER LOT BASIS

WHEREAS, the Bids and Awards Committee (BAC), as mandated by Republic Act No. 9184, otherwise known as the Government Procurement Reform Act, is the body tasked to post invitations to bid, to conduct pre-bid conferences, to determine the eligibility of prospective bidders, to receive and open bids, to conduct the evaluation of bids, to conduct post-qualification and to recommend award of contracts to the Head of the Procuring Entity;

WHEREAS, in view of the Procurement of Training Tools and Equipment for the Higher Level DAC Qualification of the 23 CentExs, the Director General created a Technical Working Group (TWG) that would assess and evaluate the requirements of the agency taking into consideration the complete technical specifications and costing of the tools and equipment. A copy of TESDA Order No. 155, Series of 2017, issued on 11 May 2017 is hereto attached as Annex "A";

WHEREAS, the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) intends to apply the sum of Two Hundred Twenty-Nine Million Nine Hundred Ninety-Nine Thousand Nine Hundred Eighty-Six Pesos and 215/1000 (Php229,999,986.215) for the Procurement of Training Tools and Equipment for the Higher Level DAC Qualification of the 23 CentExs. A copy of the Terms of Reference (TOR), Obligation Request and Status (ORS) and the Certificate as to Availability of Funds are hereto attached as Annexes "B", "C" and "D", respectively;

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WHEREAS, the BAC upon receipt of the TOR for the Procurement of Training Tools and Equipment for the Higher Level DAC Qualification of the 23 CentExs convened on 09 October 2017 at 10:06 a.m. at the CSA Conference Room located at the 2nd Floor, TESDA Administration Building in Taguig City to conduct a pre-procurement conference with the end-user's representative in accordance with Section 20 of the 2016 Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 9184. A copy of the Minutes of the Meeting is hereto attached as Annex "E";

WHEREAS, the BAC in compliance also with the directive of the Director General invited several observers registered with PhilGEPS to witness the bidding activities particularly on the Procurement of Training Tools and Equipment for the Higher Level DAC Qualification of the 23 CentExs for purposes of transparency and good governance. Pursuant to Section 13 of 2016 Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 9184, the BAC invited several observers to attend the pre-bid conference on 23 October 2017 and the bid opening on 07 November 2017. Copies of the letters to observers are hereto attached as Annexes "F", "G", "H", "I", "J", "K", "L", "M", "N", "O", "P", "Q", "R", "S" and "T", respectively;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 21 of the 2016 Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 9184, TESDA advertised the Invitation to Bid for the Procurement of Training Tools and Equipment for the Higher Level DAC Qualification of the 23 CentExs in two (2) newspapers of general circulation and posted the same in the PhilGEPS on 12 October 2017. Copies of which are hereto attached as Annexes "U", "V" and "W", respectively;

WHEREAS, responding to the abovementioned Invitation to Bid, thirteen (13) prospective bidders signified their interest to participate in said bidding process by purchasing bidding documents namely 1) Welcome Export, Inc., 2) ACMI Office Systems Philippines, Inc., 3) Gecar Machine Solutions, Inc., 4) MESCO, Inc., 5) Gaylan Technologies, Equipments, Machineries & Supplies, 6) Velca Equipment & Engineered Products Inc., 7) Hytec Power Inc., 8) Techline Inc., 9) Humil International Corp., 10) P.I. Farm Products, Inc., 11) Unotronix, Inc., 12) Goldtech International Distributors Inc. and 13) S&S Enterprises, Inc. Copies of the official receipt for the purchase of bidding documents are hereto attached as Annexes "X", "Y", "Z", "AA", "BB", "CC", "DD", "EE", "FF", "GG", "HH", "II" and "JJ", respectively;

WHEREAS, the pre-bid conference was held on 23 October 2017 at 2:10 p.m. at the CSA Conference Room located at the 2nd Floor, TESDA Administration Building in Taguig City. A copy of the Minutes of the Meeting is hereto attached as Annex "KK";

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WHEREAS, the BAC issued a bid bulletin requiring the prospective bidder to submit the certificate of registration with the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) or Cooperative Development Authority (CDA), Business Permit issued by the city or municipality where the principal place of business of the prospective bidder is located, tax clearance and the prospective bidder's audited financial statements, showing, among others, the prospective bidder's total and current assets and liabilities, stamped "received" by the BIR or its duly accredited and authorized institutions, for the preceding calendar year which should not be earlier than two (2) years from the date of bid submission during the bid opening on 07 November 2017 despite the submission of the bidder of their Philippine Government Electronic Procurement System (PhilGEPS) Platinum Certificate of Membership for purposes of further verification by the BAC. Likewise, the BAC emphasized that the bidding shall be done by lot. Each qualification shall consist of one (1) lot. There are seventeen (17) lots subject of this procurement. Only bids for all the items for each lot/qualification shall be accepted by the Procuring Entity. Bidders may bid for multiple lots/qualifications where they think they are capable of supplying. Further, the eligibility documents of the bidder would apply to the lot or all lots that the bidder will participate in. The bidder shall submit one (1) original and three (3) copies of its eligibility documents. Also, the financial component of the bid of the bidder shall be submitted by lot since the bidding is by lot and award of contract shall be on a per lot basis. The bidder's financial component must contain the Financial Bid Form which includes the bid prices and the applicable Price Schedules. The Financial Bid Form is a standard document (template) which the bidder must fully accomplish and submit during the bid opening. Correspondingly, an amendment on the technical specifications on PLC Motor Control Learning System, Pneumatics & ElectroPneumatic Training Set, Food Processor, Stove with Oven, Exhaust Hood, CNC Milling Machine, Variable Refrigerant Frequency Air Conditioning Unit with Central Controller, Inverter Type Air Conditioning Unit (Cassette), Inverter Type Air Conditioning Unit (Floor Mounted), Chopping Boards, Water Dispenser (Hot & Cold Dispenser), Thermometer, Beaker, Vernier Caliper and Air Conditioning Unit was made. A copy of Bid Bulletin No. 01 issued on 24 October 2017 is hereto attached as Annex "LL";

WHEREAS, Advance Solutions Inc., in its letter dated 24 October 2017, requested for an extension of time within which to prepare for the bid opening which is scheduled on 07 November 2017 at 10:00 a.m. Specifically, said office is requesting to reschedule the bid opening on the second week of November 2017. A copy of the letter dated 24 October 2017 of Advance Solutions Inc. is hereto attached as Annex "MM";

WHEREAS, the BAC, in its letter dated 25 October 2017, informed Advance Solutions Inc. that it cannot extend the schedule of the bid opening. As early as 12 October 2017, when the Invitation to Bid for the Procurement of Training Tools and Equipment for the Higher Level DAC Qualification of the 23 CenTEs including its Bidding Documents were posted in the website of the Philippine Government Electronic Procurement System (PhilGEPS), the additional eligibility requirements of TESDA were already listed in the said Bidding Documents. As such, the prospective bidder should have already known the requirements of TESDA as early as 12 October 2017 and have started the processing of the required clearances. A copy of the letter dated 25 October 2017 of the BAC to Advance Solutions Inc. is hereto attached as Annex "NN";

WHEREAS, ASPEN Multi-System Corp., in its letter dated 26 October 2017, requested for an extension of time within which to prepare for the bid opening which is scheduled on 07 November 2017 at 10:00 a.m. Specifically, said office is requesting for an additional fifteen (15) working days. A copy of the letter dated 26 October 2017 of ASPEN Multi-System Corp. is hereto attached as Annex "OO";

WHEREAS, the BAC, in its letter dated 27 October 2017, informed ASPEN Multi-System Corp. that it cannot extend the schedule of the bid opening. As early as 12 October 2017, when the Invitation to Bid for the Procurement of Training Tools and Equipment for the Higher Level DAC Qualification of the 23 CenTEs including its Bidding Documents were posted in the website of the Philippine Government Electronic Procurement System (PhilGEPS), the additional eligibility requirements of TESDA were already listed in the said Bidding Documents. As such, the prospective bidder should have already known the requirements of TESDA as early as 12 October 2017 and have started the processing of the required clearances. A copy of the letter dated 27 October 2017 of the BAC to ASPEN Multi-System Corp. is hereto attached as Annex "PP";

WHEREAS, the bid opening was held on 07 November 2017 at 10:15 a.m. at the CSA Conference Room located at the 2nd Floor, TESDA Administration Building in Taguig City. A copy of the Minutes of the Meeting is hereto attached as Annex "QQ";

WHEREAS, Velca Equipment & Engineered Products Inc. did not submit its bidding documents on 07 November 2017 and the BAC did not hear any word from said bidder. Hence, Velca Equipment & Engineered Products Inc. was automatically disqualified from the bidding;

WHEREAS, Techline Inc. did not submit its bidding documents on 07 November 2017. The representative of the bidder mentioned that they were not prepared with their bidding documents. Hence, Techline Inc. was automatically disqualified from the bidding;

WHEREAS, only Gecar Machine Solutions, Inc., Gaylan Technologies, Equipments, Machineries & Supplies, P.I. Farm Products, Incorporated, Welcome Export, Inc., Humil International Corporation, MESCO Inc., Unotronix Inc., Goldtech Intl. Distributors, Inc., Hytec Power Inc. and ACMI Office Systems Philippines, Inc. passed the eligibility requirements pursuant to Sections 23 and 25 of the 2016 Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 9184. A copy of the Eligibility Requirements Checklist and Abstract of Bids are hereto attached as Annexes "RR" and "SS", respectively;

WHEREAS, S & S Enterprises, Inc. was declared ineligible to bid due to its failure to submit the clearances/certifications from the Department of Labor of Employment (DOLE), National Labor Relations Commission (NLRC), Social Security System (SSS), Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) and Pag-IBIG Fund issued within three (3) months from the date of the bid opening which is part of the additional eligibility requirements of TESDA as stated in Clause 5.1.4 of Section III (Bid Data Sheet) of page 40 of the bidding documents during the bid opening on 07 November 2017;


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WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 55.1 of Rule XVII (Protest Mechanism) of the 2016 Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 9184, S & S Enterprises, Inc. had been given three (3) calendar days from 07 November 2017 or until 10 November 2017 within which to file its request for reconsideration;

WHEREAS, S & S Enterprises, Inc. filed its request for reconsideration on 09 November 2017 which is within the prescribed period set forth by law. The bidder argued that its failure to submit the clearances/certifications issued by DOLE, NLRC, SSS, PhilHealth and Pag-IBIG Fund during the bid opening attributed to the fact that it had purchased bidding documents a day before the bid opening, which is on 07 November 2017. The bidder attached in its request for reconsideration the clearances/certifications issued by NLRC, SSS and PhilHealth. Its request from DOLE and Pag-IBIG Fund for issuance of clearances/certifications is still pending. S & S Enterprises, Inc. requested that the clearances/certifications be treated as requirements to be submitted during the post-qualification. Likewise, the bidder argued that the value of the outstanding contracts stated in the statement of on-going government and private contracts of the bidder should be One Hundred Fifty-Nine Million Two Hundred Thirty Thousand Six Hundred Seventy-One Pesos and 65/100 (Php159,230,671.65) instead of Eighty-Nine Million Four Hundred Fifty-Two Thousand Four Hundred Fifty-Three Pesos and 35/100 (Php89,452,453.35). As such, the bidder submitted a corrected computation of its Net Financial Contracting Capacity (NFCC). A copy of its request for reconsideration is hereto attached as Annex "TT";

WHEREAS, in its BAC Resolution No. 53-2017 issued on 10 November 2017, the BAC denied the request for reconsideration of S & S Enterprises, Inc. stating that as early as 12 October 2017, the bidding documents containing the eligibility requirements of TESDA among others for this procurement were posted in the websites of TESDA and PhilGEPS when the Invitation to Bid was posted in the newspapers of general circulation namely the Philippine Daily Inquirer and the Philippine Star. As such, any prospective bidder would have access to browse the bidding documents and check on the requirements of the Procuring Entity. It is not the fault of TESDA that S & S Enterprises, Inc. only decided to purchase the bidding documents a day before the bid opening which is on 07 November 2017. This is also to consider that out of the eleven (11) bidders, ten (10) bidders complied with the submission of said clearances. It must be emphasized that the TESDA Board as the approving authority of all domestic and foreign contracts required the submission of the clearances/certifications from the DOLE, NLRC, SSS, PhilHealth and Pag-IBIG Fund to ensure that the bidders comply with the labor laws and standards. As such, the BAC denied the request for reconsideration of S & S Enterprises, Inc. due to non-submission of the bidder of valid clearances/certifications from the DOLE, NLRC, SSS, PhilHealth and Pag-IBIG Fund as part of the eligibility requirements on 07 November 2017 during the bid opening. A copy of BAC Resolution No. 53-2017 issued on 10 November 2017 is hereto attached as Annex "UU";

WHEREAS, the BAC Resolution No. 53-2017 issued on 10 November 2017 was received by S & S Enterprises, Inc. on 16 November 2017. Said bidder had been given seven (7) calendar days from 16 November 2017 or until 23 November 2017 within which to file its request for reconsideration pursuant to Section 55.3 of Rule XVII (Protest Mechanism) of the 2016 Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 9184 and the period within which to file a protest had already lapsed without the bidder having filed any protest pursuant to said law;

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WHEREAS, S & S Enterprises, Inc. issued a letter dated 23 November 2017 which was received by TESDA on 24 November 2017. The bidder argued that it has partially but substantially complied with the requirements of TESDA on the submission of the clearances/certifications from the DOLE, NLRC, SSS, PhilHealth and Pag-IBIG Fund. It had submitted the certification from DOLE and the certification from Pag-IBIG Fund is still being processed. S & S Enterprises, Inc. requested that such requirements be treated as part of the post-qualification. Likewise, the bidder requested that its request for reconsideration dated 09 November 2017 be granted and that the BAC Resolution No. 53-2017 issued on 10 November 2017 be set aside. A copy of the letter of S & S Enterprises, Inc. dated 23 November 2017 is hereto attached as Annex "VV";

WHEREAS, in its letter dated 24 November 2017, the BAC stated that S & S Enterprises, Inc. was held ineligible due to its failure to submit the clearances/certifications from the DOLE, NLRC, SSS, PhilHealth and Pag-IBIG Fund during the bid opening on 07 November 2017. Hence, a request for reconsideration was filed on time by the bidder which was subsequently denied by the BAC on 10 November 2017 and such denial was received by the bidder on 16 November 2017. Likewise, instead of submitting this letter dated 23 November 2017, a protest should have been filed before the TESDA Board subject to the requirements prescribed by the abovementioned law. It must also be noted that the period within which to file a protest had already lapsed on 23 November 2017. A copy of the letter of the BAC dated 24 November 2017 is hereto attached as Annex "WW";

WHEREAS, accordingly, a Technical Evaluation Group (TEG) was created to conduct bid evaluation vis-à-vis agency requirements taking into consideration the completeness of the bid in terms of technical specifications and pricing and to verify/check the performance of the bidders relative to their previous contracts with the government and private entities as provided by Section 34 of Republic Act No. 9184. A copy of the BAC Order No. 08, Series of 2017, issued on 09 October 2017 is hereto attached as Annex "XX";

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 34 of Rule X (Post-Qualification) of the 2016 Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 9184, verification and validation of the bidder's legal documentary requirements must be made. As such, the TEG issued letters to the Accounts Receivable Monitoring Division of the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR) for the validation of the tax clearances issued by said office to ACMI Office Systems Philippines, Inc., Gaylan Technologies, Equipments, Machineries & Supplies, Goldtech Intl. Distributors, Inc., Humil International Corporation, Hytec Power Inc. and P.I. Farm Products, Incorporated, to Metropolitan Bank & Trust Company for the validation of the Credit Line Certificates (CLC) and bank guarantees of ACMI Office Systems Philippines, Inc. and Goldtech Intl. Distributors, Inc. and to Land Bank of the Philippines for the validation of the line of credit of Hytec Power Inc. Copies of the letters are hereto attached as Annexes "YY", "ZZ", "AAA", "BBB", "CCC", "DDD", "EEE", "FFF", "GGG" and "HHH", respectively;

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WHEREAS, the abovementioned offices had issued confirmation letters regarding the documents submitted by Humil International Corporation, Hytec Power Inc., P.I. Farm Products, Incorporated, Goldtech Intl. Distributors, Inc., Gaylan Technologies, Equipments, Machineries & Supplies and ACMI Office Systems Philippines, Inc. for the Procurement of Training Tools and Equipment for the Higher Level DAC Qualification of the 23 CenTEs. Copies of the confirmation letters of the Accounts Receivable Monitoring Division of the BIR, Metropolitan Bank & Trust Company and Land Bank of the Philippines are hereto attached as Annexes "III", "JJJ", "KKK", "LLL", "MMM", "NNN", "OOO", "PPP" and "QQQ", respectively;





WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 25.2.a (viii) of the 2016 Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 9184 which requires prospective bidders or its duly authorized representatives to submit a sworn statement in the form prescribed by the GPPB that it complies with existing labor laws and standards, compliance by the bidders with the foregoing shall be supported with the clearances or certifications from the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), National Labor Relations Commission (NLRC), Social Security System (SSS), Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) and Pag-IBIG Fund. Clearances must be issued at least within three (3) months from the date of bid opening. This is pursuant to GPPB Resolution No. 01-2008 issued on 07 March 2008 giving the procuring entity the discretion whether to require the clearances from the bidders;

WHEREAS, ACMI Office Systems Philippines, Inc. submitted during the bid opening a certification from the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) certifying that it has no pending case before said office in compliance with the eligibility requirements prescribed under Clause 5.1.4 of Section III (Bid Data Sheet) of page 40 of the bidding documents. Copy of the foregoing certification is hereto attached as Annex "RRR";

WHEREAS, ACMI Office Systems Philippines, Inc. submitted a certification from National Labor Relations Commission (NLRC) certifying that it has no pending case before said office. Copy of the certification issued by NLRC is hereto attached as Annex "SSS";

WHEREAS, ACMI Office Systems Philippines, Inc. submitted a clearance from Social Security System (SSS) certifying that ACMI Office Systems Philippines, Inc. has remitted the contributions of its employees from June 1998 up to September 2017 to SSS and that it has no pending case before said office. Copy of the clearance issued by SSS is hereto attached as Annex "TTT";

WHEREAS, ACMI Office Systems Philippines, Inc. submitted a certification from Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) that it has remitted premium contributions of its employees from January 2017 up to September 2017. Copy of the certification issued by PhilHealth is hereto attached as Annex "UUU";


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WHEREAS, ACMI Office Systems Philippines, Inc. submitted a letter dated 06 June 2017 from Pag-IBIG Fund informing the bidder that the issuance of the clearance certificate will not exculpate them as an employer from accountability if subsequent findings show existing violations attributable to misrepresentation, fault, negligence, or fraudulent intent to comply with the law. Likewise, the issuance of the clearance certificate from said office can be requested only once a year. Copy of the letter dated 06 June 2017 issued by Pag-IBIG Fund to ACMI Office Systems Philippines, Inc. is hereto attached as Annex "VVV";

WHEREAS, the TEG issued letters to the DOLE, NLRC, SSS, PhilHealth and Pag-IBIG Fund for the validation of the documents issued by said offices to ACMI Office Systems Philippines, Inc. Copies of the documents are hereto attached as Annexes "WWW", "XXX", "YYY", "ZZZ" and "AAAA", respectively;

WHEREAS, the abovementioned government agencies had issued their respective confirmations regarding the clearances/certifications submitted by ACMI Office Systems Philippines, Inc. for the Procurement of Training Tools and Equipment for the Higher Level DAC Qualification of the 23 CenTEs. Copies of the confirmation of the DOLE, NLRC, SSS, PhilHealth and Pag-IBIG Fund are hereto attached as Annexes "BBBB", "CCCC", "DDDD", "EEEE" and "FFFF", respectively;


WHEREAS, Gaylan Technologies, Equipments, Machineries & Supplies submitted during the bid opening a certification from the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) certifying that it has no pending case before said office in compliance with the eligibility requirements prescribed under Clause 5.1.4 of Section III (Bid Data Sheet) of page 40 of the bidding documents. Copy of the foregoing certification is hereto attached as Annex "GGGG";

WHEREAS, Gaylan Technologies, Equipments, Machineries & Supplies submitted a certification from National Labor Relations Commission (NLRC) certifying that it has no pending case before said office. Copy of the certification issued by NLRC is hereto attached as Annex "HHHH";

WHEREAS, Gaylan Technologies, Equipments, Machineries & Supplies submitted a clearance from Social Security System (SSS) certifying that Gaylan Technologies, Equipments, Machineries & Supplies has remitted the contributions of its employees from March 1995 up to September 2017 to SSS and that it has no pending case before said office. WHEREAS, Gaylan Technologies, Equipments, Machineries & Supplies submitted a certification from Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) that it has remitted premium contributions of its employees from September 2016 up to August 2017. WHEREAS, Gaylan Technologies, Equipments, Machineries & Supplies submitted clearance certificate from Pag-IBIG Fund that it has remitted premium contributions of its employees from January 1998 up to August 2017. 

WHEREAS, Goldtech Intl. Distributors, Inc. submitted a clearance from Social Security System (SSS) certifying that Goldtech Intl. Distributors, Inc. has remitted the contributions of its employees from February 2000 up to September 2017 to SSS and that it has no pending case before said office. Copy of the clearance issued by SSS is hereto attached as Annex "XXXX";

WHEREAS, Goldtech Intl. 




As such, the BAC declared a failure of bidding on Procurement of Training Tools and Equipment for the Higher Level DAC Qualification of the 23 CenTExs for Lot 10 (Warehousing Services).
