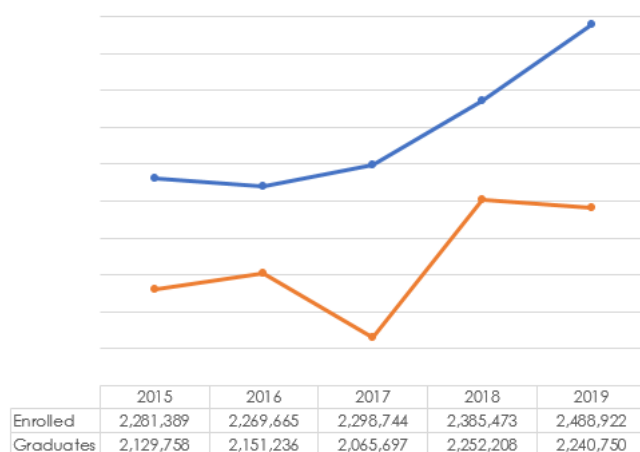


FIG. 2. Number of Enrolled and Graduates: 2015-2019

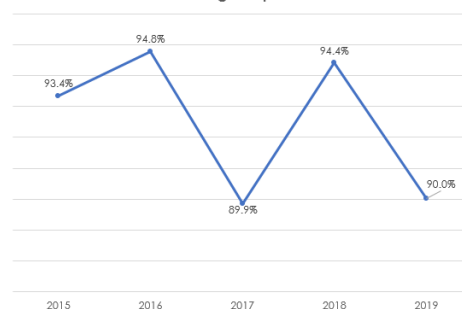


FIG. 1. Completion Rate: 2015 – 2019

The data shows that for the past five (5) years, there is a continuous increase in the number of TVET enrollees, while for TVET graduates a decrease is observed in 2017. On the other hand, the data also shows changes in the trend of the completion rate of the TVET graduates, wherein significant decrease are recorded in 2017 and 2019.

Majority of TVET enrollees and graduates are female, however the difference is only 6.0% for enrolled and 1.7% for graduates.

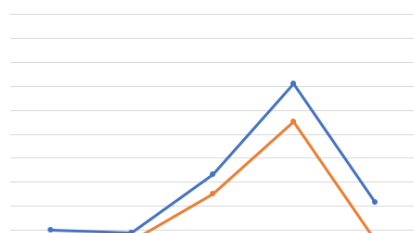

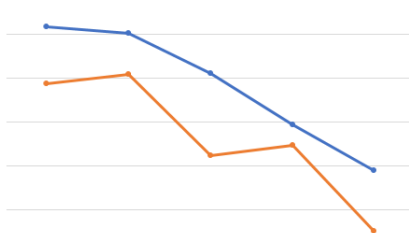

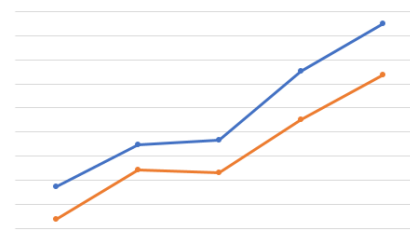

In terms of training venue, most of the enrollees and graduates are from the Community Based Training with 5,726,694 and Institution-Based Training with 5,161,211; which is 48.8% and 44.0% of the total enrollees, respectively. It is significant to note that the Enterprise-Based Training remains to have the lowest accounted number of enrollees which is only 3.4% of the total enrollees for the last five years. Similar results are observed for the graduates by training venue.

NOTE: Data on the monitored training venues from 2015 to 2018 are accounted in the Community-based training program. However, starting 2019 monitored programs are under 'monitored' as per Memorandum no. 181, s. 2019: Reporting of the Training Outputs. Monitored programs are "skills training programs that have TVET component conducted by other National Government Agencies and other skills training that have to be reported to TESDA. Some of these are from NGAs' conducted skills training programs, TVL track graduates, DepEd Alternative Learning System (ALS), and others.

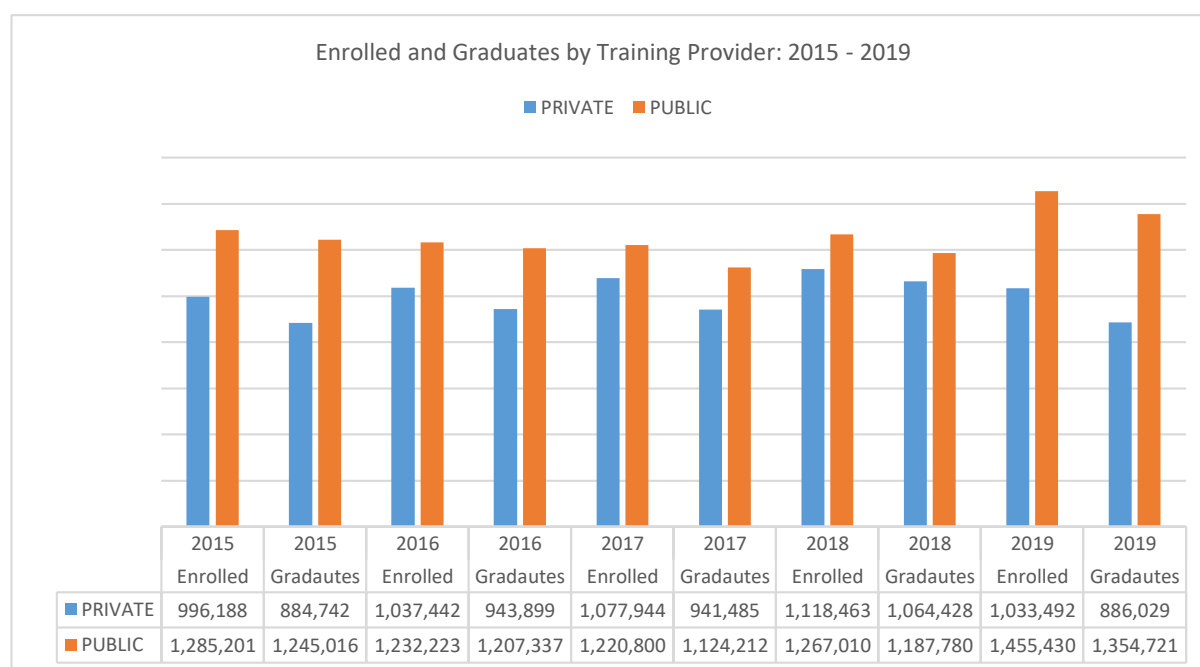


FIG. 6. Number of Enrolled and Graduates by Training Provider: 2015 – 2019

Public Institutions have the most number of enrolled and graduates compared to private providers from 2015 to 2019. These public training providers have more output despite being less in number than the private institutions, this can be attributed to the the community-based training that are implemented by the public providers, which covers the TTIs, LGUs, NGOs, and NGAs. These said CBT programs are usually short-term courses that are conducted in minimal duration.

For the last five (5) years, most of TVET enrolled and graduates have taken programs under the following sectors: Tourism (Hotel and Restaurant); Social, Community Development and Other Services; Electronics; and Information and Communication Technology. The outputs of the said sectors can be attributed to the current trends in terms of the requirements of the industry. Likewise, the availability of the infrastructure (training providers, trainers, assessment center, assessors, etc.) in the programs under those sectors could also possibly influenced the high outputs. On the other hand, similar factors should also be considered for other sectors that have low outputs.

Number of Assessed and Certified: 2015 - 2019

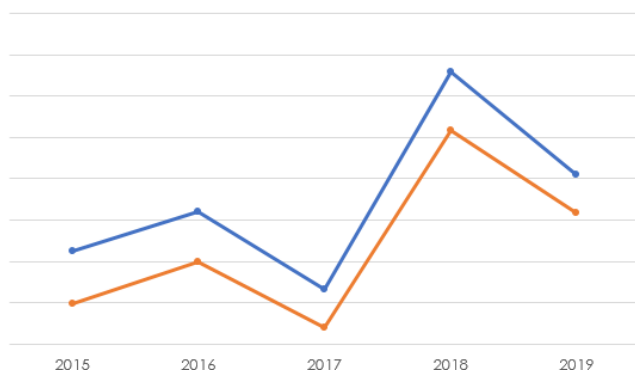


FIG. 7. Number of Assessed and Certified by Year: 2015 - 2019

Certification Rate

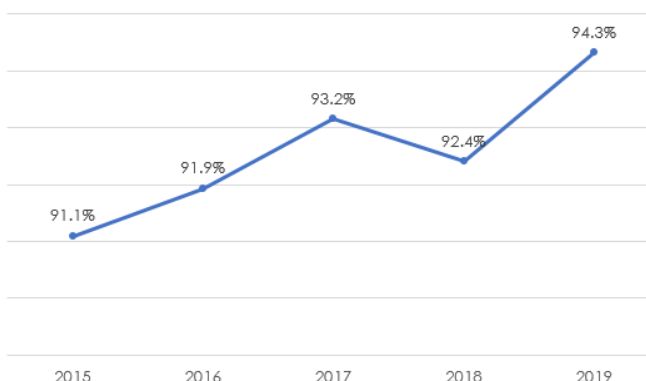


FIG. 7. Certification Rate: 2015 - 2019

Number of Competency Assessors by Region: 2017-2019

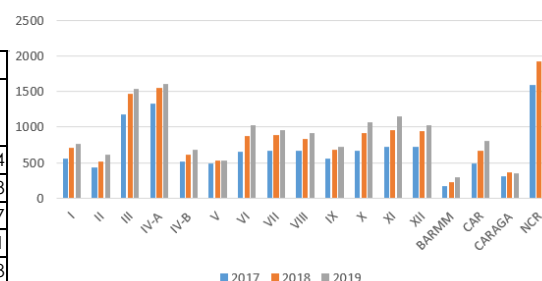


FIG. 8. Number of Competency Assessors by Region: 2017 - 2019

Number of Assessment Centers by Region: 2017-2019

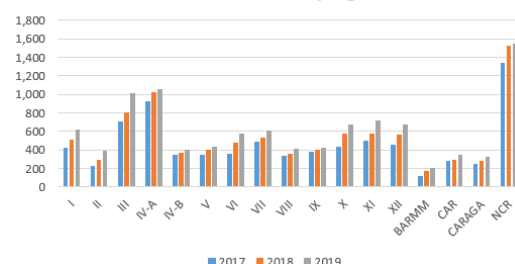


FIG. 9. Number of Assessment Centers by Region: 2017 - 2019

Number of NTTC Holders by Region by Year: 2017 – 2019

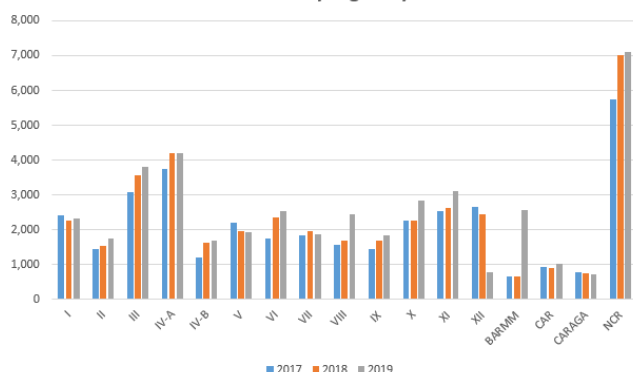


FIG. 10. Number of NTTC Holders by Region by Year: 2017 – 2019

TESDA National Capital Region remains the top region with the highest number of NTTC holders, while BARMM has the lowest number of NTTC holders. 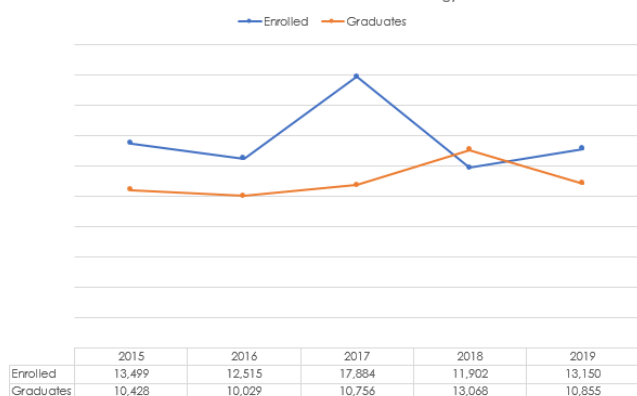


FIG. 11. Number of Enrolled and Graduates of Trainers' Methodology I by Year: 2015 – 2019

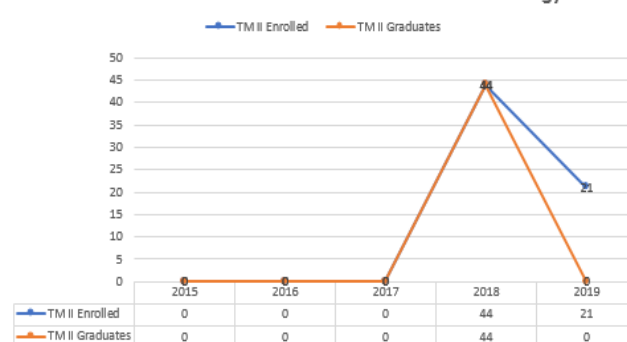


FIG. 12. Number of Enrolled and Graduates of Trainers' Methodology II by Year: 2015 – 2019

Number of TVET Providers - 2019

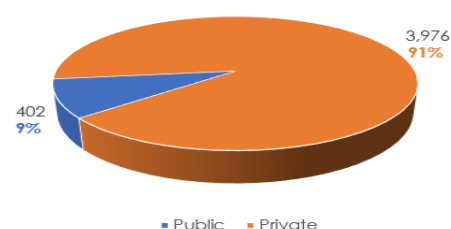


FIG. 13. Number of TVET Providers as of 2019

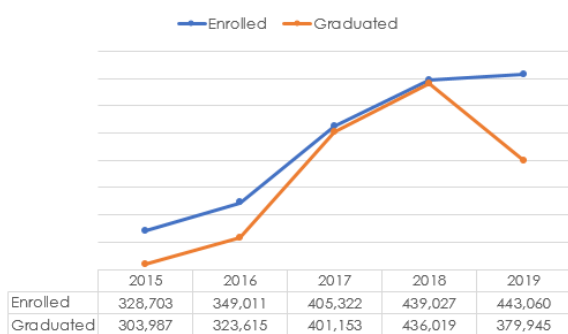


FIG. 14. Number of Enrolled and Graduate Beneficiaries of TESDA Scholarship Programs: 2015 – 2019

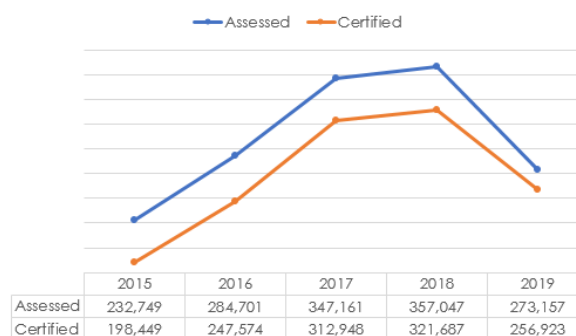
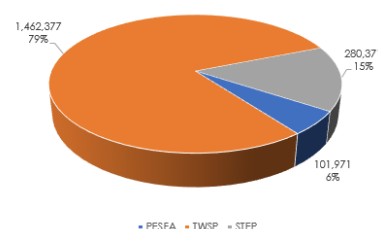


FIG. 15. Number of Assessed and Certified Beneficiaries of TESDA Scholarship Programs: 2015 – 2019

Among the scholarship programs, TWSP accounted majority of enrollees, graduates, assessed and certified. This can be attributed to the budget allotted for the implementation of the programs.

In general increase in the beneficiaries/enrollees of TESDA Scholarship program is increasing from 2015-2018. However, decrease in the number of graduates, assessed and certified for TWSP is recorded in 2019.

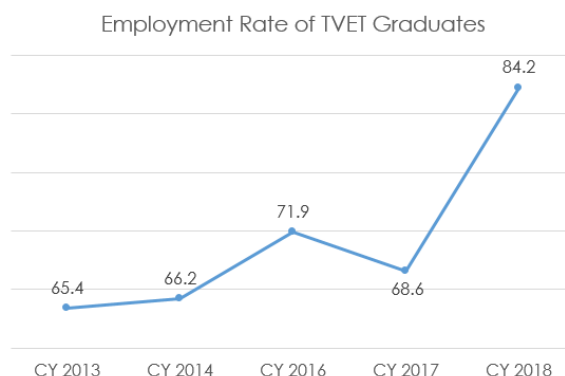


FIG. 16. TESDA Graduates' Employment Rate

The increase in employment rate is evident for graduates from 2015, 2016, 2018 and 2019 survey rounds, while decrease is recorded in 2017. The highest percentage difference is accounted in 2019 results with 22.17 % difference from the 2017 results.

Employment Rate of TESDA Graduates of Institution-based Training Venue

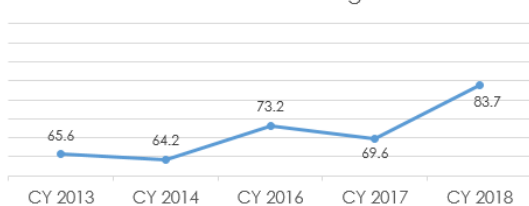


FIG. 17. Employment Rate of IBT-based Training Graduates

Employment Rate of TESDA Graduates of Community-based Training Venue

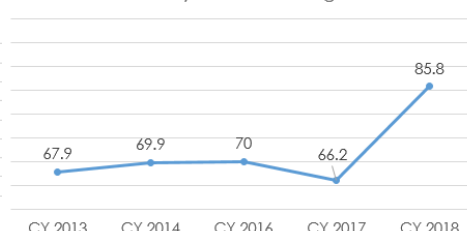


FIG. 18. Employment Rate of CBT-based Training Graduates

Employment Rate of TESDA Graduates of Enterprised-based Training Venue

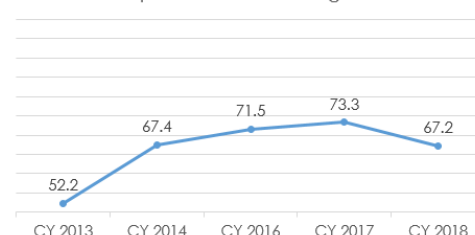


FIG. 19. Employment Rate of EBT-based Training Graduates

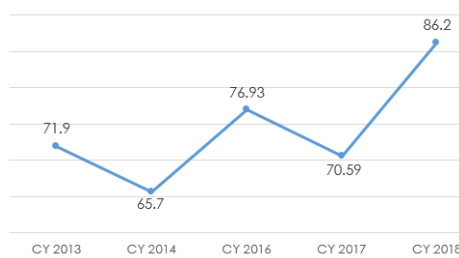


FIG. 20. Employment Rate of TWSP Graduates

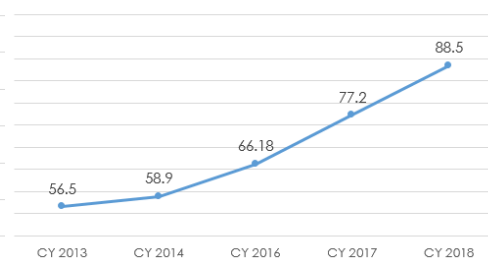


FIG. 22. Employment Rate of PESFA Graduates

In terms of employment rate by type of scholarship, constant increase is recorded for graduates of PESFA. From 2014-2019 survey round an average of 74.53 employment rate is observed in the graduates of TVET under the scholarship programs.



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
