As of the 2nd quarter of 2023, the overall progress for the accomplishment rate for the target number of enrollees rose to 28%, noting of a 20.92% increase from the previous quarter. To which, Region II still leads by being the only area to have met the prescribed accomplishment rate of 50% relative to the time of the year.

Although, the Region II might have secured its lead in terms of percentages, in terms of raw amount, Region VIII takes the lead by having roughly over an 11x fold increase from its previous figure. Further detailing this instance with Region VIII, their previous accomplishment rate was just at 3.87% to it current figure of 46.70%.

For the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter, the overall raw output of the regions increased by 194% from the previous quarter; the overall accomplishment rate has increased by 16.37%. But it should be noted that despite their increases, they still fall short of their prescribed targets to be able to meet the ideal accomplishment rate of 50%.

Despite the fact that no Region was able to meet the prescribed rate, it should be noted that they made some excellent improvement based on their previous figures of the last quarter. Most notably with Region VIII which made a 34% increase. This is then followed by Region II with a 28.75% then by CARAGA with 25.18%.

For the 2nd quarter, about 18% increase in the accomplishment rate of assessed and certified individuals. The accomplishment rate for assessed and certified are only 32,.28% and 32.56 respectively, falling short of the ideal target of 50% in respect to the time of the year. Moreover, the certification rate is at 97.77% compared to the 92.32% last quarter.

Detailing this, the overall total of the Community-based enrollees alone still outnumbers the combined total of both Institution-based and Enterprise-based. The same story can be said with the number of graduates where in which the combined total still falls short by 21%.

The number of total enrollees for the 2nd semester rose to almost 300% compared to the previous quarter; but it should be taken note that although it has increased a large amount, most of it is concentrated through the Community-based mode accounting to a 42.92%. A large departure from the ideal distribution between the delivery modes of 25%.

Table no. 6b shows an added number of delivery modes implemented as compared to the 1st quarter. Particularly, the NGA's training programs, PAFSE, and Trainings conducted in farm schools/enterprises. Although their shared contribution only accounted for 0.12% to the overall number of trainees to the Institution-Based Training delivery mode. Further, an increase of over 468% as compared to the previous quarter. Additionally, the face-to-face learning method is the largest contributor with 60%.

Table 9 shows an added EBT method through the LGU-oriented community-based program. The same program has an overall tally amounting to 5.8% from Regions VII and XII. Further, an increase of 106% has been added wherein 35% came from the Trainings Conducted in Farm Schools/Enterprises, which is then followed by the Program on Accelerating Farm School Establishment (PAFSE) with a figure of 27%.

Table 10 shows 2 added CBT method through the 'Combination of Distance Learning and Face-to-Face' and 'Trainings Conducted in Farm Schools/Enterprises'. Of which, the aforementioned both contributed a total of 0.4% of the overall total for the CBT.

Aside from this, the overall enrollees have increased by 178% as compared to that of the 1st quarter. Of which, the 'Extension Programs of TTIs' has the largest number of enrollees with an increase of 135% from its previous number during the 1st quarter. This increase accounts for 42% of the overall total.

This is then followed by the 'LGU-oriented community-based program' with a 35.8% of the total figure. Additionally, a 219% increase in the number of enrollees from the previous quarter was made under this category.

Lastly, it should be noted that the distribution of demographics, particularly between the male and female continues its increase. This quarter on the other hand continues this trend with a 2.5% shift resulting in the 57.07% for female and 42.93% male.

Furthermore, the 'Extension Programs of TTIs continues to have the highest number of graduates for the 2nd quarter accounting for 43.36% of the total amount of CBT graduates this quarter having an increase of 139% from the previous quarter. This is then followed by the 'LGU-Oriented Community-Based Program' which increased by 219.15%.

Furthermore, there has been a drastic increase in the number of enrollees for the 2nd quarter. Based from its previous figure for the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter it increased by 582.42%. As of June 2023, there has been a notable increase in EGACs from the different scholarships. The most notable of which is from the TWSP, wherein it had the most amount of EGACs contributed to the overall figure. Further detailing, the 54.77% or 557 increases in enrollees compared to the previous quarter, 68% of came from TWSP, followed by TTSP 27.83%, next is UAQTEA with 3.59%, and lastly is STEP .0.36%.

The table above shows a notable increase for both the enrolled and graduates under the TM I with 179.44% and 116.83% respectively. Furthermore, in regards to the partnerships per sector, the Tourism sector has the most number with 18%, which is then followed by the construction sector at 14%.




